From the desk of Reverend Ken...

Though we are in a traditional time of slowing down for the summer months, I stay busy with calls and letters, visits and worship. I hope that YOU are able to meet with me in one of those settings, because I care deeply that you know and feel that you belong.

I have a deep desire to develop our Congregation with inner strength and serenity as well as acting together with courage and resolve. The Church I am called to lead can and will be able to provide safety and warmth in the midst of staying relevant with the issues of the day, or, leading into the future.

I hope you have already heard that I am calling to each one of you to be a part of a mini seminar on prayer. I ask two, 1-hour commitments of you this September 21 and 28. You can attend at church or through Zoom (and I will make the seminar available to watch recorded). You can attend the in-person and then go to the Zoom session the next week if you need to, and vice-versa.

This is all about re-orienting ourselves with prayer's benefits for us personally and corporately. All our doings, if wrapped up in prayer, can have miraculous and Spirit-supported powers. Hopefully prayer will assist us when we have followed something less than constructive. Under it all, prayer will bind us in a compassionate fellowship. I pray that it will settle old hurts, current misunderstandings, and avert us from future troubles. I pray that by doing so, our prayer will inform us and perspective members that ours is a safe and productive gathering of the hopeful, of the compassionate, of the passionate, and of the justice minded.



CONSISTORY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Consistory Minutes — May

May minutes were approved at the June meeting.

New Business:

- Need for Music Audio/Visual upgrades for permanent set up in the sanctuary. Don spoke about items needed for this. He presented info on the wiring and electrical items requested including 3 boxes that would have combo electrical/audio/HDMI/SDI ports to eliminate/hide wiring showing and having to be covered in the sanctuary now. The approximate cost for the 3 boxes would be \$1,700-\$2,000. There was talk about a future purchase of a different projector that would have a longer span and higher lumen but that was tabled for now because costs can range from \$1,600-\$4,000 for that item alone. There was info presented on wireless mics that would cost approximately \$650, and that was tabled as well. A motion was made by Alec to spend \$1,700-\$2,000 for materials plus labor of a licensed electrician (labor to be reported back to Consistory once quoted for any objections). Funds to be used out of a Memorial Fund or wherever Brian sees fit; second was made by Chuck Bauer. All in favor.

Consistory did not meet in July.

As always, the vast majority of our Designated Gifts are received in December, so we will show as under budget throughout the year.

Investment Income is running at 50% of YTD Budget. This is partly the result of stock market performance and partly due to the annual pacing of some investments.

Transfers of Unrestricted Funds will occur throughout the year as needed:

Total transferred to date in 2022 is **\$36,000** out of **\$ 138,120** budget

An additional transfer of **\$48,000** of unrestricted funds will take place in July.

Insurance Expenses are running about \$375 (28%) per month over budget.

Extenuating circumstances with ongoing Property concerns.

The following Annual Expenses have already been paid: Computer Support (Administrative), Worker's Comp (Personnel), Music & Copyright (Worship & Music), Gettysburg Association (Mission), One Great Hour of Sharing (Benevolence).

No Capital Expenses incurred YTD, therefore this item is under budget \$46,296.

Several projects are planned before the end of the year. Some will be covered by the recently received State Grant for Safety Improvements totaling **\$20,975**.
