Forging a Future – Plan B(ee)

About 4.8 million people live below the poverty line in Honduras, with agriculture as their main source of income, they have faced the challenges of inadequate earnings, unfavorable weather, and insufficient infrastructure. As a result, many young people have left rural farming communities for work elsewhere.

Rosa Castro, aged 64, has seen this happen firsthand. She took over raising her grandchildren when her son left in search of a dependable livelihood. Rosa wants young people in her country to get a get a good education and find job opportunities in their own communities.

For a decade, Heifer has been working with Honduran communities to deal with the challenge of building profitable farms. With training on producing healthier livestock and introducing complementary practices such as beekeeping, Heifer is helping farmers like Rosa diversify their income, improve production, enhance the quality of their produce and earn sustainable living incomes for their families – all within their communities.

Beekeeping had been virtually abandoned in several areas of Honduras because of a disease called Nosema that killed many bees. To support beekeepers, Heifer organized training sessions for Farmer Field Schools on beehives, sanitation, honey production, processing and techniques to prevent diseases in bees. They also distributed 450 two-level bee hives. Currently 32 field schools in Rosa's community of Olancho produce nearly 14,000 bottles of honey a year.

To generate employment opportunities in her community, Rosa started a youth-led beekeeping initiative with the help of Heifer. She now helps a small group of young people manage 13 beehives. The group recently harvested 60 liters of honey, which they sold for about \$6 a liter. The money was reinvested in a rural bank where farmers pool their money and provide low-interest loans to each other.

Rosa's granddaughter appreciates her grandmother's resolution to inspire youth: "She is an elderly person who likes to get involved in everything that is good to the local community." Rosa envisions having a local secondary school that will help the upcoming generations access education and follow their dreams. With Heifer's help, she believes it will happen.
