

Homewood. Volunteers to cut and sew are needed. Contact Sandy Rebert or Marilyn Van Lenten.

- Homewood Foundation: The Corporate Office and Foundation have made a decision to cut expenses and schedule one regional Golf Tournament to benefit all of the Homewood locations.
- New Hope Ministries will be a recipient of a Give Local York drive to fund York County agencies. The date is May 6. Visit www.givelocalyork.org.
- The community refugee effort now has a title: Hanover Area Refugee Resettlement. We continue to collect furniture and household items, and await news of the arrival of a refugee family.
- Heifer Project: The three baby goats who visited Emmanuel on April 3 were greatly appreciated. We hope that through donations and use of Missions fund we can become an Ark Church once again. The final collection date is April 24.
- The One Great Hour of Sharing collection of \$1,350 will be matched 1:1 with Missions funds.
- Mission Sunday will be held on June 12 with guests from local agencies, who will receive donations from our Missions Funds.
- We encourage anyone who is passionate about caring for the environment to see Rev. Ken or a member of Missions to help us begin a more active environmental effort at Emmanuel.

Property & Safety Committee — April

- A grant application for enhancing our security measures has made it through the first step. If awarded, funds would amount to \$23,000 and would be used for such improvements as additional outside cameras, safety training, exterior lighting and other upgrades. These grants are being made to non-profit organizations such as schools, churches and synagogues to enhance their safety. We are one of two groups in York County selected to continue the process.
- Along the lines of safety, Officer Richey from the Hanover Police Department came to Emmanuel on March 8 to educate members and leadership on the appropriate response to a violent intrusion. In the course of his presentation, he recommended that drills be held for us to practice a coordinated response to an intruder. Plans are being laid for drills, both intruder drills and fire drills. In fact, a fire drill will be held in May. A captain from the Fire Department will be coming in advance of the first drill to make recommendations. Signs are being prepared to indicate exits and will be posted in all of our buildings. At least one tour is planned for members and friends who may not be familiar with the whole building so that they may know where the less obvious exits are located. It will also highlight fire extinguishers, alarm pulls and the AED device

A message from the Property Committee

If you have to ask, don't flush it

We experienced a sewage backup in the basement restrooms recently, so the Property Committee would like to remind you not to flush anything down the toilets but toilet paper (*read more below*). Please properly dispose of all non-flushable items in trash receptacles.



- for medical purposes. These visits by police and fire personnel also benefit us by increasing their familiarity with our buildings, in case of a disaster.
- The new personalized bricks have been ordered and will be installed during the courtyard renovation. Thank you to the purchasers. The project will be completed in two sections – first, the sidewalk and curb in front of the office and then the courtyard. While inconvenient at the time, this should vastly reduce the amount of water pooling in front of the buildings from heavy rains. The Borough Water Engineer is involved in the planning. The renovation of the courtyard will eliminate the water pouring into the earthen basement during every heavy rain.
- Problems with plumbing continue to crop up, especially with clogged plumbing. Items such as baby wipes and paper towels have been flushed into several toilets. As a result, clogs have necessitated intervention by the plumbers, an expensive solution. In the lower level, everything from the toilets, sinks and showers must go through a shredder pump and pumped up to the level of the sewer pipes under Broadway. The drain leading to that pump has been clogged with paper towels. It has taken two visits by the plumber so far, costing Emmanuel hundreds of dollars so far. **Please, if you need to clean up a disaster of some sort in a bathroom, place the paper towels in the waste basket.** Short term embarrassment is far outweighed by the expense of calling a plumber, not to mention the mess for our Sextons when pipes back up. If you need help, contact a Sexton or Rev. Ken. We're all friends and family here, so don't hesitate to ask for help.
- A flood from a detached dishwasher hose in the kitchen caused a number of floor tiles to come loose. Larry glued them down again, so we are hopeful that there are no lasting problems. Again, if you notice water on the floor, let someone know. Maria, Rev. Ken, a Sexton, Linda McKonly or a member of this committee – all are ready to help.


