From the Desk of Rev. Ken...

reetings this new September. By now you might be able to predict that I am not so much a fan of this month. Why? Honestly it leads to winter. I KNOW, winter isn't for another 3 months but the days get shorter and cooler and my body does not like that stuff. However, I know that many people revel in the cool and the cold and look forward to the holidays. And so, as in all things, this too shall not only pass, but it will endure in its own goodness.

Worship in the Sanctuary begins on September 14! So let me make you aware of a couple things coming up...

Member Appreciation September 14 has communally expressed love, just for you. Be there and be loved for who you are!

September 21 we will quickly offer a few words about safety while in the Sanctuary. Remember, in a time of danger you are the first responder. 

Missions Committee — August 6

- God's Meal Barrel served 194 families in July and 189 in early August. They expect to distribute over 170 backpacks plus school supplies in August. They are delivering food donations for clients on Wednesdays and Fridays at Food Lion, and are picking up donations from Food Lion, Weis, and Giant.
- A total of 10 volunteers gave 25 hours of service in preparing and serving the PAL Lunch on July 29. Our next PAL Lunch is Sept. 30. To volunteer, contact Estelle King.
- The annual Crop Walk is scheduled for Oct. 12.
 Judy Dubs hopes to organize a team of walkers from Emmanuel. She is part of a committee drafting a letter intended to raise the awareness of area congregations of the work HACC is doing to serve the needs of our community. The committee expects to begin visiting these congregations in September.
- The annual Homewood Auxiliary Tea was a success. Proceeds from the ticket sales and a raffle for a handmade quilt will benefit nursing care and memory care patients. Eight ladies from Emmanuel attended. The Annual Homewood Membership Drive will begin in late September to early October. Contact Peg Moulton.
- Missions agreed to sponsor a \$250 Golf Tee at the Homewood Foundation's annual Golf Tournament at Musket Ridge on Sept. 18. This donation will benefit needy residents at Homewood at Plum Creek.
- New Hope Ministries held their annual back-toschool event to provide backpacks and school supplies to area clients on Aug. 12. New Hope is partnering with HACC to share baked goods and produce. Current needs for the food bank include ketchup, mustard, and mayo. Nonfood needs include shampoo, toilet paper, and household cleaners. Upcoming events include the Adams Co. Giving spree on Nov. 6, Giving Tuesday on December 2, and Feed-A-Friend Dec. 11-12.
- The Crafters delivered 9 sweaters to Vision Works. They received a Thank-You from Homewood for lap robes and twiddlers.
- Missions agreed to add \$270 to the \$230 donated by the congregation to the UCC collection for Strengthen the Church, for a total of \$500.
- A letter from Phurbu, our sponsored child in India, is posted on the Missions bulletin board.

- Hanover Against Hunger continues to work toward the goal of raising \$44,000 to provide meals for those in need both locally and globally.
 Volunteers are needed for the meal packing event on Nov. 1. A donation program through Texas Roadhouse continues through October.
 See info on the Opportunities Table. A panel discussion on food insecurity in the Hanover area will take place on Sept. 4 at 4 pm in the new Hanover Borough administration building. All are invited. See Carol Giesey for more info.
- The English as a Second Language class that has been meeting at Emmanuel has taken a hiatus because of concerns about recent ICE activity in the area. They expect to return in the coming months.
- Missions is applying for a grant of \$100 from the Gettysburg Association to be donated to the Lower Susquehanna Riverkeepers, which is dedicated to improving the ecological health of the Lower Susquehanna River watershed and the Chesapeake Bay.
- Missions agreed to donate \$500 for a paver in support of the YWCA's capital campaign.
