From the desk of Reverend Ken...

“**T**hey” told me the weather was less harsh here... Oh well, we haven’t had snow much at all but the COLD! Oh my goodness – the cold mornings have been one after the other, haven’t they? It’s okay really, I’m quite used to it. Grew up in Cleveland, lived in Columbus, Indianapolis, Ann Arbor, and Connecticut so the cold is what I expect out of living. I did however have a 3-year break from it all when I went to seminary in Berkeley, CA. Ahhhhhhhhh, that was like eternal springtime, with about a week in January when the locals would don their goose down coats because it was 45... (can anyone say, “Give me more of that?!”)

What I’m really trying to say in a roundabout way is that so far you haven’t given me even a tiny reason to not like it around here! And, you’re stuck with me!

So, as long as you’re stuck with me I’m going to ask Consistory to study a method of communication that I told your Search Committee about. I’d like us to consider adopting what’s called a “behavioral covenant.” This is an easy-to-learn way for us to talk to and about one another. It’s simple, we would agree to always use “I” instead of “you” or “they” or “people” when expressing opinions and referring to any conflict we may have with a person or an idea. Now, why would I want us to adopt such a thing if everything is going okay, why tinker with it? Well, I know that every institution (like a church) and every family (like a church) come upon times when disagreement makes for people taking “sides.” I totally agree that there will be times when it’s normal for disagreement to arise, but what I am wanting us all to be mindful of, and this behavioral covenant will teach us to, is HOW to express ourselves.

We would covenant (a reverent agreement) to not speak for others, but only represent ourselves using “I” in order

Feed the hungry, feed your faith

Bring the commandment “love your neighbor” to life by contributing to Heifer International, which works to end hunger and poverty by providing resources to underserved communities across the globe.

A gift of baby animals and hands-on training by Heifer staff and volunteers helps families obtain nutritious food, shelter, clean water, education, access to health care and more.

Since 1987, Heifer has been Emmanuel’s Lenten Giving Project. By combining generous donations from the congregation with Missions funds, we have been able to donate \$5,000 for the past four years, which qualifies Emmanuel as an Ark Congregation. This \$5,000 fills a symbolic ark with many pairs of animals,



from alpacas to sheep, pigs and water buffalo, trios of small animals like rabbits and guinea pigs, flocks of geese and chicks, and even a beehive, and more.

The Heifer Lenten offering for 2022 will run March 6-April 3. As in past years, Heifer banks and calendars are available in the sanctuary or office. The calendars provide four weeks of fun facts about animals and the natural world, as well as ideas for a daily contribution to the bank. Giving envelopes will be available in the sanctuary. Drop in the offering or mail to the office. Make checks to Emmanuel UCC with “Heifer” in the memo. Your generosity could bring us to the \$5,000 goal, or help us surpass it! This church is something too precious to not take this kind of action, to provide it a long and orderly existence. And, if IT is well cared-for, so too will you be cared-for. So will Hanover. So will our Association and our Conference. We shall lead with a kindness and a confidence built upon everyone caring for others and being cared-for themselves.

I hope to see you in church, a place where you will be noticed; a place where you will be affirmed; a place where you will find meaning; a place where these assurances will give you space to offer all that to one another.



Consistory Minutes — December

Committee Reports:

- Cheryl reported that Sunday School is averaging 2 to 6 children and is staffed through February 2022.
- Alec reviewed several Church Growth initiatives including the downtown Hanover mailer and the Getting To Know You survey.
- Carol Sing: Held last evening, Dec. 19. It seemed to go well with approximately 100 people in attendance.

New Business:

- Lisa opened discussion on whether we should bring back any Covid precautions in light of the increasing numbers. Discussion of reinstating the mask mandate. Judy made a motion to reinstate the mandatory mask mandate indoors. Charlotte second. Vote taken. Andy opposed. Motion carried.
- Diversity Alliance: Discussion due to the points brought up after the last Consistory meeting. Consistory would like to meet with Amanda Beard-White to see what they want and if it is possible for us to meet their needs instead of guessing. Consistory to ask Maria to reach out to set up meeting to include Alec, Chuck, Dwight Dubs and Charlotte.
- Lisa Moore will be resigning as President of EUCC Consistory effective at year end 2021. She will be residing in Florida full time. Thank you and well wishes were given. Pastor Ken will help to find a replacement to fill the position.

- Rev. Committee will begin discussing during future meetings.

Missions Committee — February

- Emmanuel's next date to host the PAL Lunch at Hanover Area Council of Churches (HACC) is March 29. Contact Estelle King to volunteer.
- Volunteers at HACC have recently increased, but more are always needed.
- Homewood Foundation Funds have been divided between MD and PA, the 2 states where Homewood residences are located. The Foundation will be raising \$5 million to fund the new health and arts center at Homewood at Plum Creek.
- We have received no new information on the community effort to help an Afghan refugee family settle in Hanover.
- The UCC's One Great Hour of Sharing collection will be March 27.
- The Heifer collection will begin on March 6 and will continue through April 3.
- We received a report from Kathi Thomas, caseworker for the Salvation Army Hanover Service Unit. The office is located at Emmanuel next to the auditorium, and accessed through the side entrance. She notes increased needs in the community. Donations should be made to the Salvation Army Hanover Service Unit.

Pastor Parish Relations Committee — Feb.

- Chuck Siegel has accepted the position of Consistory president and will no longer attend PRC meetings.
- Committee is exploring the 2018 book titled "A Sure Foundation," a resource for the relationship between pastors and congregations, from the United Church of Christ's Ministerial Excellence Support & Authorization (MESA) Team.
- Committee discussed the addition of a new member, and the term rotation of members.
- Conversed with Rev. Ken about the support of his leadership and the committee's advisory guidelines. Rev. Ken expressed his excitement and optimism with his first 10 weeks at Emmanuel UCC.

Property & Safety Committee — February

- The committee met in person for the first time in many months. Background was given for some of the projects undertaken in the last few months.
- The roof above the Gathering Space leaked in the ice a month ago. In better weather, an inspection and repair will be done. It has not leaked in subsequent snows. Inspection and repair of the slate will also happen in warmer weather. We have a contract for inspection each spring.

Property & Safety Committee seeks new members

► Anyone interested in the upkeep of church facilities and security plans is invited to join the Property & Safety Committee. For info, contact Chair Linda McKonly at 717-632-6379 or gsmck@comcast.net.

- The louvers in the towers are completely painted and are beautiful. Since no one at Emmanuel can recall why the screens were installed initially, the committee has agreed to leave the louvers uncovered for now. If bird nests or other issues arise, this decision will be reconsidered. Covering them with screens did protect the paint and wood, so painting will have to occur more frequently. Estimates for some routine painting will be obtained. It is a continuous process to keep our buildings in good repair.
- Security procedures are being examined. The local police department will provide a program on safety for religious institutions next month.
- Extensive masonry work should begin in April, depending on the weather. The memorial bricks will be reinstalled in the courtyard when it is revamped. New opportunities for memorial bricks will be offered.
- A plasterer who is capable of repairs to the ornamental plaster in the sanctuary has been located and will visit Emmanuel to assess the situation. Following plaster repairs, an expert in stenciling will repair the damaged areas. We own the master stencils for all stenciling in the sanctuary, so cutting a stencil should be relatively easy. Stay tuned.

Worship & Music Committee — February

- Monthly attendance and livestreaming statistics show an increase for the in-person attendance and a slight decline in the "unique" livestream viewing (viewers using different log-ins).
- The choir's annual "Spaghetti Supper" will not be held, but instead a sale of the famous Spaghetti Sauce and Egg Dressing will be held in March.
- The church calendar of services includes Ash Wednesday, March 3 – Rev. Ken will hold a noon Prayer Time, with ashes. The annual Ash Wednesday Service will be held at 7 p.m.
- The possibility of livestreaming the summer services in air-conditioned King Auditorium is being studied.
- Don announced another concert has been added to the EUCC series. He said a harpist will perform a Memorial Concert for Joan Wertzberger.
