Consistory Minutes — October

Old Business:

- *Membership Review Letter*: tabled.
- Proposed Bylaws Change: Maria to mail out to members prior to Dec. 19 Congregational Meeting.
- CROP Walk update: Four walkers participated. Andy submitted \$655 collected to date, anyone that has any donation to please submit it asap. Question: Is Mission's matching the donation? Laura will ask and report back with the answer.
- Children's Christmas Program: Jamie to take over program and it will likely be presented Sunday, December 19, in place of the sermon.
- Rev. Ken's Press release: Alec to finalize and release in mid-November.

New Business:

- Carol Sing: Discussion of requirements. Alec to make a motion to advertise to say that seating will be limited, masks required, and it will be live streamed in real time. Alec made a second. Vote taken. Majority in favor. Two were opposed.
- New Consistory members for 2022: Tom Daryman and Jess Beavers will need to be replaced. Discussion included suggestions and Charlotte may have a name to bring forward; Lisa will approach congregational members about joining. Hopeful to have a commitment by next meeting.

- * October 1: Diversity Festival at Moul Field
- * October 27: Halloween Parade – hand out flyers/candy to parade watchers
- * November 25: Christmas Parade – hand out flyers/candy to parade watchers
- * December: Downtown Christmas Tree Wars
- * Add Main Street Hanover Sip and Stroll events, when posted
- Inreach: “Getting to Know You” project. The Committee liked the idea of asking members to write a paragraph about themselves.

Fellowship Committee — December

- We had a reception of cookies, chips and punch on Dec. 5 to honor Pastor Ken’s first Sunday. We also gave him a large poinsettia.

Missions Committee — December

- God’s Meal Barrel provided 60 turkey dinners with trimmings to the community.
- Emmanuel’s next PAL Lunch at Hanover Area Council of Churches is March 29. Volunteers are needed from 9 am to 1 pm. Contact Estelle King.
- Homewood Auxiliary: Peg reports that 42 members paid annual dues, for a total of \$231. We also donated 38 boxes of tissues, 7 bottles of lotion, 30 angels made by the Crafters, and 30 Christmas cards signed by the Games Group.
- Homewood Foundation: The final total for annual golf tournament is \$46,000.
- New Hope Feed-A-Friend Food Bank Drive occurred Dec. 9 and Dec. 10. Missions phoned in our donation of \$1,000. Over \$150,000 items were collected.
- New Hope: We agreed to donate \$200 for cleaning and personal items that are not covered by the Food Bank.
- Harvest Home: We delivered about 100 grocery items, divided among God’s Meal Barrel, HACC, and New Hope Ministries.
- Afghan refugee effort: We are awaiting updates from All Saints Episcopal as to when a family may arrive in the Hanover area.
- Recycling: We delivered 14 pairs of eye glasses to the Lions Club. We continue to collect canceled stamps to benefit residents at the Brethren Home, as well as used umbrellas for our members’ use. We no longer collect aluminum cans and pull tabs.
- We continue discussions on streamlining the calendar of collections, and ways to involve more members of the congregation in Missions work.
- End-of-Year Missions disbursements of the \$7,653 remaining from our budget plus Yard Sale

proceeds:

- * \$1,000 to the New Hope Food Bank
- * \$1,000 to the Salvation Army, Hanover Service Unit
- * \$1,000 to the Red Cross in response to the December tornado devastation
- * \$1,000 to the UCC collection for the Christmas Pastor’s Fund
- * \$500 to Lutheran Camping Corp., in partnership with the Penn Central Conference
- * \$300 to the Homewood Auxiliary Membership Drive
- * \$200 to New Hope Ministries for cleaning and personal items
- * \$2,653 to Hanover Area Council of Churches

Property & Safety Committee — December

- The end of November and early December have been busy for this committee. Due to the previously mentioned repaving of Broadway by PennDOT scheduled for next year, the painting, masonry and repair or replacement of the screens covering the arched openings in the towers became imperative. The lack of a curb in front of the sanctuary has already caused drainage problems during rains—even light rain. Adding more pavement to the street will cause water to pour into the area below the Narthex, causing damage. The courtyard has settled unevenly, causing water to pour into the basement of the sanctuary, endangering the foundation on that side. The sidewalks and curb will be replaced, in addition to the courtyard and steps to the office. The high painting of the louvers covering the arches has to be completed using a lift. The lift cannot be used on new concrete for fear of damage.
- The painters were able to come just before Thanksgiving and completed the painting of the louvers in four days. (*See photo, next page*) The lift allowed for the removal of the screens and it appears that those screens protected the paint on the louvers. They required little scraping and sanding and no repair. The screens have been removed to a contractor’s workshop for possible replacement or repair. At this point, it is a possibility that aluminum-framed screens can be fabricated to fit the spaces but that is still being researched. The screens are necessary to keep birds from sitting and/or nesting on the louvers. In any event, the screens will be installed by the end of March, before the masonry work begins. The mason will come in the spring to begin the work. If PennDOT indicates that work will begin before we’re ready, the mason will do the curbs first and



finish the rest after the repaving. In the courtyard, all memorial bricks will be reinstalled in a channel in the concrete in the center of the courtyard, preserving them and allowing for better drainage. A new porch for the office will provide better footing, as the brownstone has deteriorated. The steps will access from the side toward the courtyard, allowing for a future ramp, if the congregation needs one.

- The Little Library was removed to allow for access by the lift to the tower on that side. It is just placed in the existing hole for now, since the lift will return in the spring. At that time, it will be reinstalled properly. There was damage to some of our shrubbery from the lift. New shrubs will be planted in the spring, after all of the work is complete.
- The slate roofers arrived the same day as the painters. More than 30 slates were replaced, along with some flashing. The disappearing leak at the front of the sanctuary (it leaks only when rain comes in a certain direction) was determined to be another flashing issue and will be repaired as the schedule for the roofing contractor allows.
- The electrician came and replaced the fixtures on the spotlight on the south side of the building. Another light was installed on the side of the addition on the courtyard side. Now both the Old and New Testament windows will again be spot lit. A porch light was installed over the office door and some interior spotlight bulbs were replaced. The security light mounted high on the outer wall of the auditorium along the sidewalk had a shield installed to reduce the light shining on our neighbor's house. The electrician will return to install a pole and a new spotlight at the cemetery, but not until the weather is warmer.
- A boiler inspection, required every two years, will be done in early January.
- There are some issues with several locks, so that will be addressed shortly. Other concerns about doors that do not close properly and broken or damaged hinges will be addressed as the budget allows.
- Covid 19 remains a concern. We will be following CDC guidelines regarding masking and social distancing.

Stewardship Committee — December

- For the 2022 stewardship campaign, we received 23 pledges for a total of \$83,200 to date.
- The Stewardship Committee sent thank you notes to all of those who sent in a pledge.



The screens and frames were removed for repair and workers painted the trim and louvers on the towers during the week of November 15.

Worship & Music Committee — December

- A brief discussion of the previous services was held followed by a review of the livestreaming viewing statistics.
- Noteworthy future services include:

- Charlotte announced that Chuck Siegel will become the new committee chair.
